THE LASTING REFORMATION

What is the MAIN COMMAND that all other commands POINT TOP

Mateo 28:18-20

And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying All authority s given to Me in Heaven and in earth. 19 Therefore go and make (lisciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all things, whatever I commanded you. And, behold, I am with you all the days until the end of the world. Amen.

What are the 3 STEPS to fulfill the COMMAND?

Go = bring the gospel to the lost, not the lost to the gospel Baptize = repentance and remission of sins (Luke 24:46-47)

Teach to obey = training to train, obedience vs. knowledge



THE PROCESS OF GROWTH

- For indeed because of the time, you ought to be teachers, you have need that one teach you again what are the first principles of the oracles of God. And you have become in need of milk, and not of solid food. For everyone partaking of milk is unskillful in the Word of Righteousness, for he is an infant. But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, even those who because of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil. Hebrews 5:12-14

- They have met God, and their sins have been forgiven (1 Joh 2:12-13)
- ✓ They need time to grow (Heb 5:12)
- ✓ They need to learn the basics about how the gospel works (Heb 5:12-6:1)
- ✓ They need to learn the basics of skills (Heb 5:13; Mr 16:15-20)
- They need to learn how to overcome their flesh, they are still battling sin (1 Cor 3:1-2)





- ✓ They are strong (1 Joh 2:14)
- They know and obey the Word of God (1 Joh 2:14)
- They need to learn to eat solid food through practice and use (Heb 5:14)
 - They need to deepen their relationship and understanding of God



- They understand the big picture of the Gospel, they know God more deeply (1 Joh 2:12-14)
 - ✓ They can discern good from evil (Heb 5:14)
 - √ They have skills (Heb 5:13; Mr 16:15-20)


